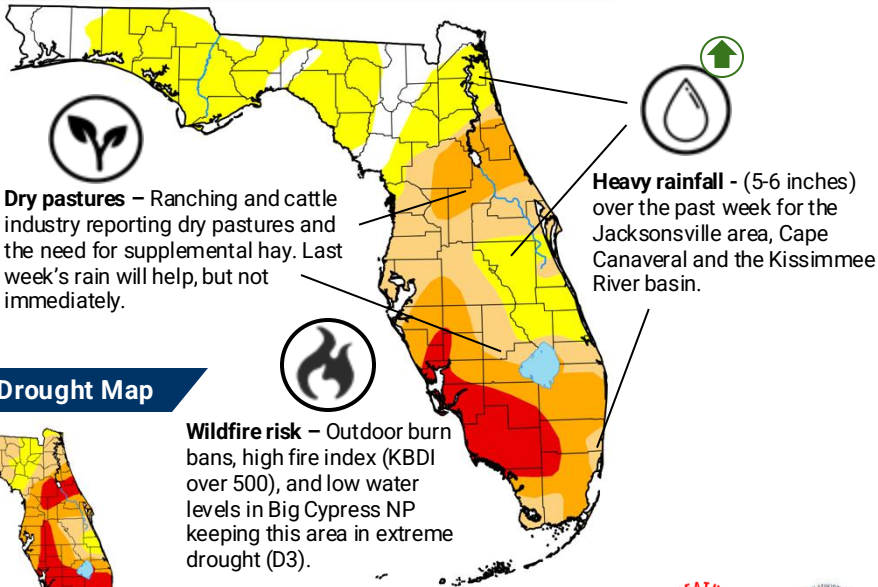


Florida Drought Update

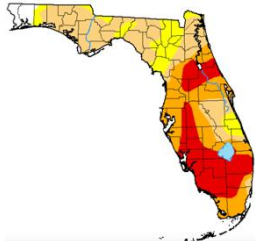

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? A stubborn cutoff low-pressure system along the northern Gulf coast led to plentiful and even heavy rainfall across most of the State. Weekly rainfall ranged from 2-3 inches to 5-6 inches in some areas.

Current Pattern: High pressure builds over the State and eastern Gulf and lasts through the weekend. Little to no rainfall and above normal temperatures are expected in all regions for the next 7 days.

What's Next? May 15 is the designated start to Florida's summer rainy season. Expect afternoon thundershower activity to increase after the current high pressure breaks down. ENSO neutral conditions will continue for the coming months with little effect on our weather.
