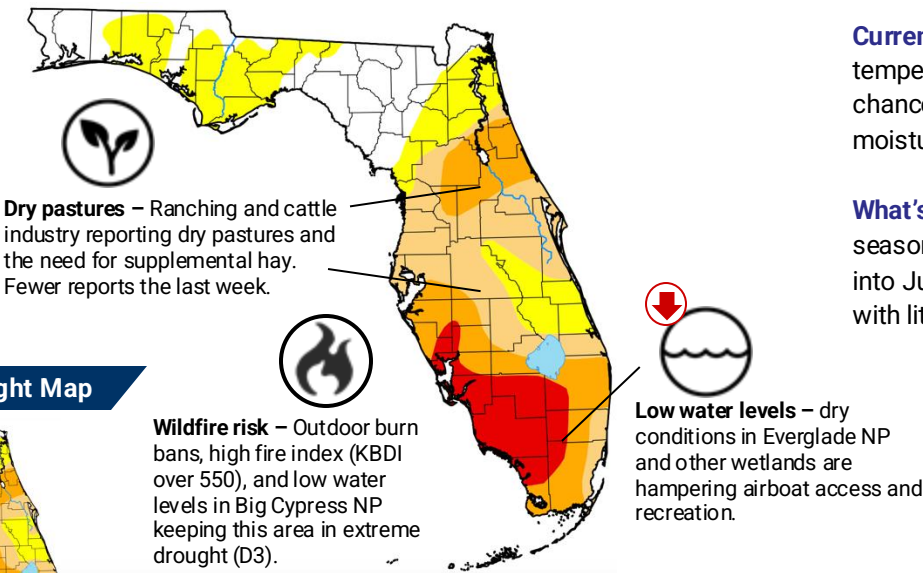


Florida Drought Update

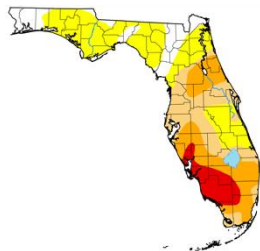

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? The **heavy rainfall** and **severe weather** stayed well to our north this past week, leaving the State mostly dry over the last 7 days. Abnormally dry (D0) conditions eased in parts of the Panhandle, but moderate (D1) to extreme drought (D3) continues over the peninsula.

Current Pattern: **High pressure dome** brought unusually warm temperatures at 4 to 6 degrees F above normal to many stations. Rain chances are highest in southeast Florida with a decaying front and ample moisture forecasted.

What's Next? May 15 was the designated start to Florida's summer rainy season. Expect afternoon thundershower activity to increase as we head into June. ENSO neutral conditions will continue for the coming months with little effect on our weather.
