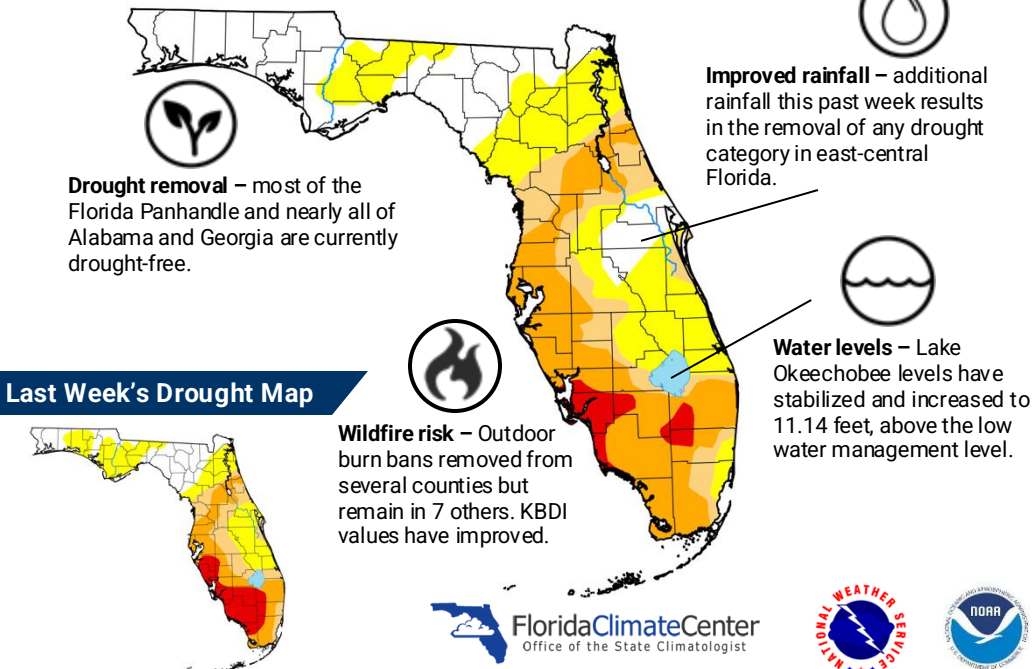


Florida Drought Update

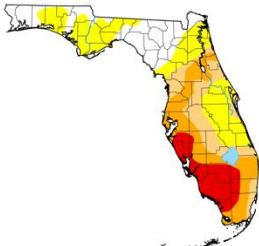

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? Widespread coverage of 2-3 inches of rainfall over central Florida, up to 6 inches over interior south Florida leads to additional drought improvement this past week. The **summer rainy season**, enhanced by low pressure in the eastern Gulf, is well under way.

Current Pattern: **Low pressure trough** will lift north of the area bringing higher pressure and lower moisture in the atmosphere. Rain chances will be mostly associated with normal afternoon sea breeze convection.

What's Next? May 15 was the designated start to Florida's summer rainy season. Expect afternoon thundershower activity to continue. ENSO neutral conditions will continue for the coming months with little effect on our weather. Atlantic hurricane season is forecast to be above average, but not as active as last year.
