

Florida Drought Update

Statewide Condition Summary

What's Changed? Predominantly easterly flow the last 2-3 weeks has enhanced afternoon convection on the west side of the State, while leaving the eastern areas much drier. Drought conditions have improved in southwest Florida but degraded along some areas of the east coast.

Current Pattern: Mid-level low pressure will slowly drift northwest across the state, enhancing rainfall across the peninsula and bringing heavy rain to the Panhandle.

What's Next? Drought conditions should continue to improve as we are mostly looking at long-term deficits that will ease with summer rainfall. ENSO neutral conditions will continue for the coming months with little effect on our weather. Atlantic hurricane season is forecast to be above average, but not as active as last year.
